

Kingsland Bay State Park

Kingsland Bay State Park sits on the shores of Lake Champlain. Much of the 264-acre park is a State Natural Area.

The historic Hawley House was built around 1790 with stones from the ruins of Fort Ticonderoga. The house served as an inn for travelers, with ferry service from Kingsland Bay across the lake to New York. The second floor served as a ballroom for dances and festivities.

During the War of 1812, the Hawley House was used for housing the militia. At the turn of the 20th century it became a monastic retreat and the bell tower was added to the structure.

The Hawley House has been partially renovated and contains local history displays developed by the Lake Champlain Maritime Museum, State Historic Sites, and Vermont State Parks.

From 1924-1974, the property was the location of the *L'Ecole Champlain* girls' summer camp.

Today, the park is a popular place to hold weddings, reunions and other events. With access to Lake Champlain, the expansive lawns are also popular with swimmers, boaters and picnickers. The renovated banquet hall, theatre building and Hawley House are capable of hosting groups from 10-150 people. A package of promotional material for weddings is available from our Reservations Center.
