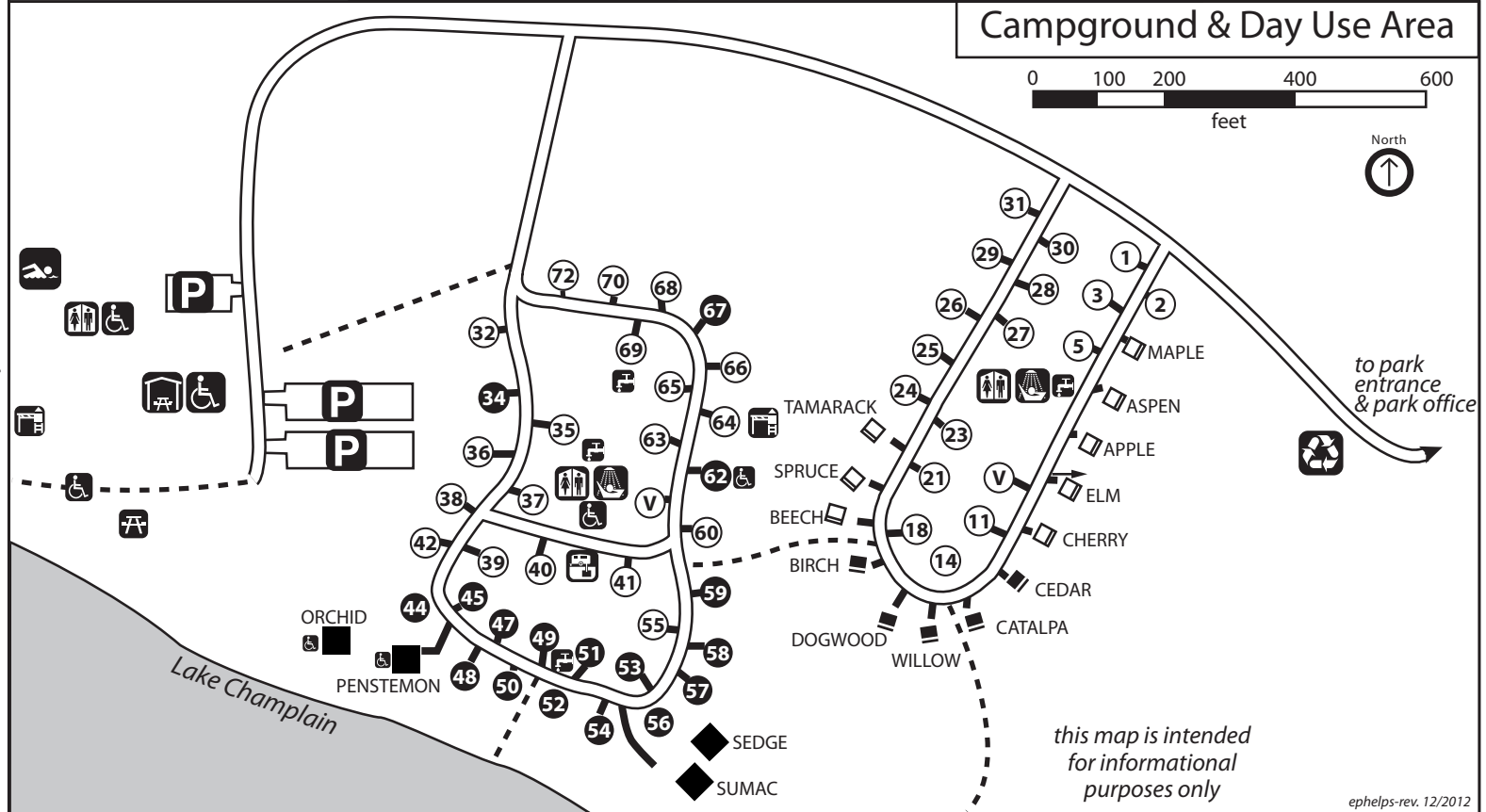
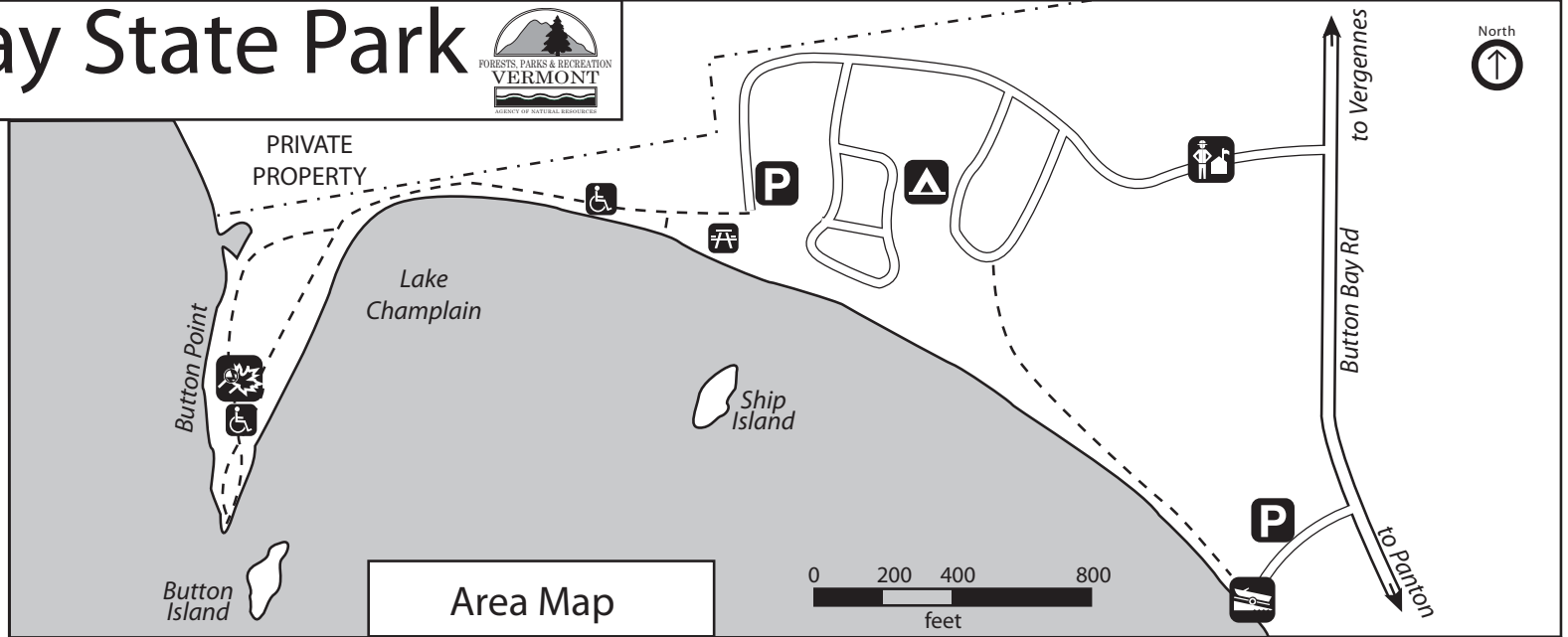

Button Bay State Park

Welcome to Button Bay State Park.

This 253-acre park is located on a bluff along Lake Champlain. Historically, the area has been visited by such notables as Samuel De Champlain (1609), Ethan Allen (1776), Ben Franklin (1776), and Benedict Arnold (1777). The park grounds once operated as a farm. The state park was created in 1964 and is named for the button-like concretions formed by clay deposits found along its shoreline.
